



Starting School

All children will start school on a part-time basis.



This helps children develop an awareness of their new classroom and helps them become familiar with new routines.

- Milk all children are entitled to free milk every day until they are 5. Please register with Cool Milk



Our day


- Our day is continuous. We do not stop for playtime because we learn through play all day. We have snack, milk and a story mid-morning.
- Children can explore both inside our classrooms and outdoors. We encourage the children to use both classes.
- We come together for carpet times to develop communication, language and social skills. We also play games and begin to learn basic counting and number skills. Length of inputs and how we teach is adapted during the year to meet the needs of the children.


Term 1

- This will be all about settling into school, taking on board change and establishing relationships with adults and peers in school.
- The focus is encouraging the children to feel happy and confident in their new surroundings.
- We will be sharing lots of stories and nursery rhymes and doing small group activities to get to know each other and make friends.




- We follow the same routine when we come into class every morning:
 - put name on self-register
 - put water bottle in the box
 - hang up coat and bag/book bag
 - put any reading books in the box





Phonics and Reading

- We will begin to teach Phonics.
- · We use the Little Wandle Program.
- More details about this will come home shortly.



Reading books at home

- Sharing books- children choose a book to share with you at home.
- Once they are ready, and they are blending- they will bring home a phonic reading book.
- 5 or more reads/shared reading in a week= a reading certificate and a raffle ticket, where they could win something at the end of term.



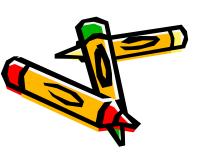

Class Dojo and achievements


- Star of the week certificate every week.
